Case Study How we work to support young people.

One particular young person came to college feeling demotivated because of previous well intentioned attempts to support his education not fully meeting his needs.

Joint working with teaching, nursing and therapy enabled him to access all aspects of the curriculum and to be as independent as possible in the college.

Next step was to develop his independence in the community.

Adaptations

 His wheelchair was adapted to enable use of a head switch to independently operate his wheelchair.

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 Further joint work enabled him to use his head switch to operate the computer, and communication aids which gave him the ability to make independent choices and communicate in group activities.

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 Use of his head switch enabled him to access an internal work placement, progressing to an external work placement at a major high St bank. He was able to communicate using his aids with the staff at the Bank and with some members of the public.

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Working with families

- College staff trained his parents in their home environment to enable him to be more independent at home when playing his music, watching T.V. and using the computer to watch You Tube.
- College organised MDT with Palliative Care Team and family meetings half termly to keep all in touch with difficulties faced and overcome.
- We worked on a Transition Programme with him, using a PA to support in his work placement.

Keeps in touch using social networking.

SL's Traineeship Experience

- Traineeship student
- Course in renal unit, during dialysis
- Breaks in course when too poorly to study
- Work placements broke down.
- Work team secured suitable placement.
- Building a social life soft skills
- Met a partner
- Her first job.
